#### *Background to the data set*

The texts in this data set stem from a corpus of Qashqai set up by Sohrab Dolatkah as part of his PhD dissertation. The folktales are based on recordings of interviews conducted with speakers during field work in Iran since 2007. The fully glossed and translated texts are available in Dolatkah's 2019 grammar of Qashqai.

The two speakers in this data set both belong to the Jamabozorgi subtribe of the Amaleh tribe, and were recorded in towns in Fars Province, Iran.
